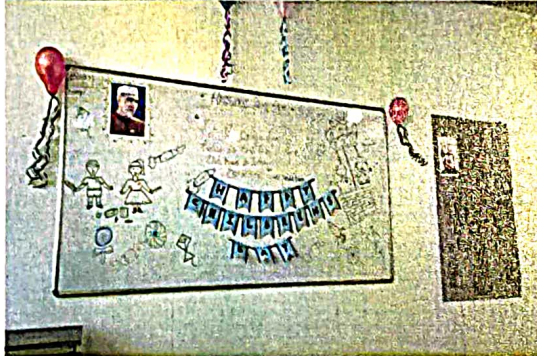
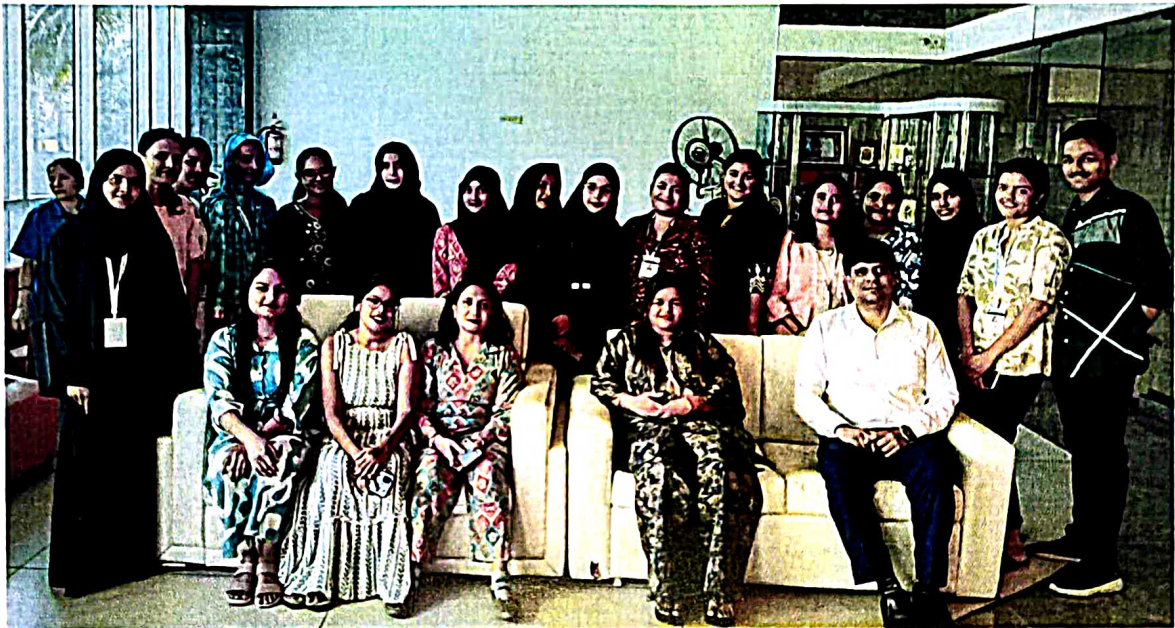

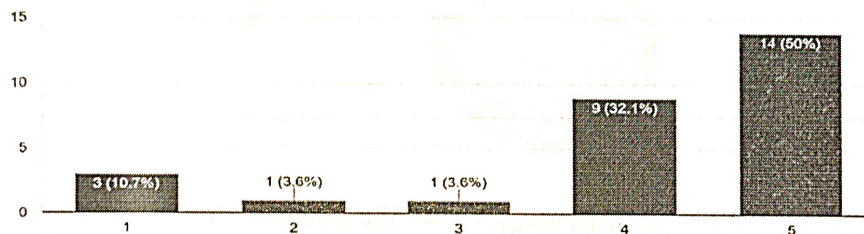


How would you rate your overall experience at the events?

28 responses



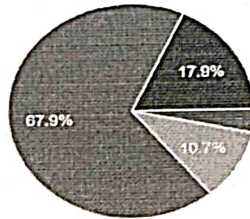

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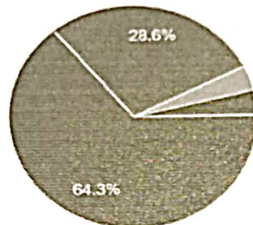
Were the speakers or presenters articulate and well-prepared during the assembly?

- Not Relevant

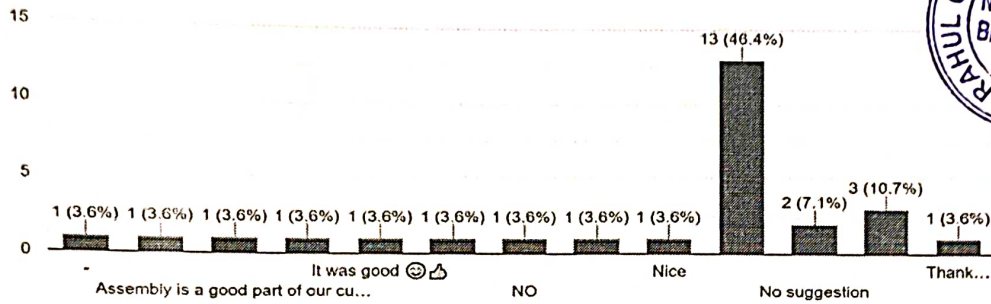
