







MARATHI BHASHA DIVAS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS










expectation and experience reflects a successful execution of the event, as it managed to meet the anticipated standards and possibly even surpass them, leading to a satisfactory outcome for attendees.





suggests that the organizers successfully created a fitting festive atmosphere for the event, with the vast majority of attendees expressing satisfaction with the decorations and ambiance.


