

#### The Christmas celebration- Feedback analysis


#### AY 2024-25

1. How would you rate your overall experience at our Christmas celebration



- Majority of Responses: The majority of the students (about 75-80%) rated their overall experience as 4 or 5, indicating that most were satisfied or very satisfied with the event.
- Some Lower Ratings: A few students rated the event a 3 or 1, suggesting that there were some individuals who were less satisfied.
  - Reason for Lower Ratings: A possible reason for these lower ratings could be due to expectations not being met or specific issues like lack of participation or other factors not fully addressed during the event.

### 2. Did the event meet your expectations?




- Yes (90% of responses): The majority of students indicated that the event met their expectations, showing overall approval of how the event was planned and executed.
- Maybe (10% of responses): A small percentage of students were uncertain, which may suggest that their expectations were partially met, but there was room for improvement in some aspects.

#### 3. Satisfaction with the Variety of Activities and Entertainment:



- **High Satisfaction (5 ratings):** A large number of students (around 70%) were very satisfied with the variety of activities and entertainment, rating it a 5.
- Some Discontent (3 or lower ratings): A few students felt the variety of activities could have been better, with ratings of 4 or 3.
  - Suggestions for Improvement: Some comments suggest that a wider range of activities or more interactive participation could have improved the event, particularly from students who rated it lower.

- Mostly Positive Feedback: Most students (about 80%) were happy with the decorations and ambiance, rating them as fitting for a festive celebration.
- Mixed Responses (Maybe): A few students indicated uncertainty or less enthusiasm, possibly feeling that the decorations could have been more elaborate or festive.

#### 5. Suggestions for Improvement:

- General Suggestions:
  - Inclusion and Participation: Several students suggested more inclusive participation and making the event more special for everyone. This could mean involving more people in the planning or activities.
  - Carol Singing or Skits: There was a suggestion for student-led activities like carol singing or skits, which could add a personal and interactive touch to the celebration.
  - Earlier Start and Better Planning: A few students mentioned that the event could have started earlier, and there was a suggestion for more time for execution, implying that the event might have been rushed.
  - Gift Giving: One student suggested incorporating gift-giving, either as part of the event or as a charitable act for those in need, which would align with the traditional spirit of Christmas.
  - More Participation in Activities: There was a call for more student participation in various activities to make the event more dynamic and engaging.

#### General Conclusion:

- Positive Overall: The event was well-received by most students, with high satisfaction ratings regarding the overall experience, entertainment, and ambiance.
- Some Areas for Improvement: The feedback highlights areas for growth, such as increasing inclusivity, providing more interactive activities, starting the event earlier, and ensuring better planning for smoother execution. Additionally, incorporating more student-driven performances (like carols or skits) could elevate the celebration.
