school	Practice teaching schools perceive the B.Ed curriculum as well-balanced, emphasizing content knowledge and practical methods. Core subjects, practical experience, and faculty support were highly rated, although there was room for improvement in specialization options and modern teaching methods. The program was seen as inclusive, though some suggested more hands-on experience and enhanced digital teaching methods.
