




Hindi Diwas Celebration Feedback analysis AY 2024-25

2. Did the event effectively promote the importance of the Hindi language?





4. Did the Hindi Diwas celebration effectively convey the value of promoting and preserving the Hindi language and culture?




The celebration effectively conveyed the importance of promoting and preserving Hindi language and culture, as confirmed by nearly all participants. This indicates
