

- The concern and phobia regarding the Action research subject prevailed and the alumni sought to help the students in building their action research project, students were afraid to take the subject as an elective, yet no student opted for Action Research as an elective subject.
- Students had a lot of difficulties, particularly regarding the internship opportunities and they requested for internships to be provided in the CBSE/CISCE/ and Cambridge curriculum. The same was adopted.
- The mentors observed that this batch of mentees were clear and articulated about their learnings and were confident as well as responsible.
- The mentor-mentee ratio was kept similar at an average of 1 Mentor: 8 Mentees.
